WHAT WE BELIEVE

Pleasant View Christian Academy is an integral part of the ministry of Pleasant View Baptist Church. Therefore, the practice and teachings of this school reflect the Bible-based teachings of our church. We realize that several of our distinctives are quite controversial in the day in which we live, and that many professing Christians disagree with us. We desire, however, to stand firm on the Word of God and remain separate from the world while at the same time reaching out to the lost.

Below we discuss the topics that have proven to be the most controversial so that you will know exactly where we stand. These are not "hobbyhorses" and are simply presented here to give you a clearer picture of this ministry.

- It is our conviction that Christians should be modest (not calling attention to oneself) in every area of life. In the age in which we live, a lack of modesty is most common in dress and behavior. Based on the Bible principles of distinction between the sexes and modesty, we believe that shorts (for men and women), tank-tops, and "muscle" shirts, and pants (for women) are unscriptural. We also stand against clothes with pictures of slogans that contradict any Scriptural principle. We request that students not wear any school-related clothing when dressed contrary to the stand of this school. Regarding behavior, we expect our students to be above reproach with regard to decency, honesty, integrity, and morality.
- Parents and siblings of our students are considered a part of the PVCA "school family" and are expected to respect the church/school testimony by dressing in modest apparel while on campus or attending school functions, both on our campus and at other schools. "Dress and Conduct of the School Family" is addressed clearly in the Student Handbook.
- We do not believe that outward conformity to rules such as these creates inward holiness. We do believe, however, that: no area of our life should be a hindrance to someone else, our testimony as a child of God is extremely important, and that we should "lay aside every weight and the sin which doth so easily beset us." Hebrews 12:2
- We believe that the Old Kind James Bible is the preserved Word of God for English-speaking people. (Psalms 12:6-7) We do not correct it or try to give a better rendering of a word.

We understand that many people do not agree with us on these issues. We do, however, expect our students to comply cheerfully with the stand of the school. We will not tolerate students bragging or displaying a "smart" attitude about areas of disagreement with the school.

STATEMENT OF COOPERATION

It is understood that my child's attendance at PVCA is a privilege and not a right; and that if at any time his/her conduct, academic progress, or cooperation with the school's authorities is not in keeping with the school's requirements, the school reserves the right to terminate at its discretion my child's enrollment.

I give permission for my child to take part in all school activities. I absolve the school from all liability in the event my child is injured at school or during any school activity. I agree with the school's efforts to train my child in the Bible and will encourage my child in this and in all other phases of the curriculum.

I pledge not to interfere with the school in its efforts to administer discipline to my child in accordance with the standards the school sets for itself. I understand that the school's discipline program includes corporal punishment.

If my child voluntarily withdraws or is requested to withdraw by the school, I understand that I will be refunded half of the monthly tuition only if the withdrawal date is before the fifteenth of the month, and will be refunded no monthly tuition if the withdrawal date is on or after the fifteenth of the month. I am aware that no transcripts will be mailed until my child's account has a zero balance. I understand that my child's report card will not be issued at the end of each nine week period unless my account is up-to-date.

In case of an accident or illness, I request the school contact me. If the school is unable to reach me, I hereby authorize the school to call my physician and to follow his instructions. If it is impossible for the school to call my physician, the school may take whatever steps they deem necessary and prudent until such time as they reach me.

I understand the following facts:

- Tuition payments must be kept current with our FACTS tuition management drafts. Failure to comply without adequate explanation will result in the dismissal of my child.
- Violation of rules established in the Student Handbook will be followed through with discipline in all cases. Discipline may include spanking (1-4 swats) in the presence of a witness.
- Uniform requirements must be followed precisely. If for any reason the proper uniform could not be worn, the student must bring a note to the office before classes begin.
- I and my family are expected to honor the dress code as defined under "Dress and Conduct of the School Family" in the Student Handbook.
- New students enrolling in PVCA must have a physical examination.

I agree to the standards, rules, and policies explained to me in the Student Handbook. I will do my part in helping my child to understand and abide by those guidelines as long as he/she is a student at PVCA.
